- strong key skills in English, maths and communication

Curriculum and support

We provide a wide range of exciting learning opportunities that are relevant and engaging for all pupils. We have a strong emphasis on teaching core skills, especially speaking, reading, writing and maths.

The curriculum is adapted during the year to suit the educational needs of each cohort of children. A range of educational visits, invited visitors to the academy, themed days, special projects and workshops extend pupils' learning.

Our curriculum leads to successful pupils with:

- enthusiasm and motivation for learning
- determination to reach high standards of achievement
- openness to new thinking and ideas
- secure values and beliefs
- a sense of physical, mental and emotional wellbeing
- self-respect





Our curriculum covers

English | writing | phonics reading | maths | science history | geography | art music | physical education *(including swimming lessons)* personal development

- physical and emotional wellbeing | world knowledge

Personal development is a key focus in the academy. Pupils develop core skills such as working with others, problem solving, predicting, making choices, organising and taking responsibility for their work.





Support and guidance

Within each of our class groups, pupils are supported by their teacher and a number of teaching assistants. All staff are qualified to lead and/or assist with lessons, together with providing appropriate social and emotional support.

We meet the individual needs of all pupils, including offering challenge and encouragement to gifted children, providing guidance to those children who may have trouble with learning, and giving focused support to those with special educational needs. We individually assess the needs of all pupils, and provide support on a one-to-one basis or in groups where appropriate.

Children with a particular physical need will also receive help from the local authority's special needs support services.

A day at the academy

Our academy starts at 9am and pupils have six classroom lessons during the day. There is a morning break and a staggered lunchtime to ensure all pupils are able to eat in comfort and with friends from their year group. The day ends at 3.30pm when children are collected from the academy by their parents or guardians.

Academy day begins

Doors open from 8.50am and close at 9am.

Break time for all children

Pupils have a morning break. There is a large playground and a large field that allows children to get fresh air, spend time with friends and develop through these interactions. All playtimes are supervised by staff.

Reception and key stage 1 pupils have their lunch from 12-12.30pm, at which time the key stage 2 children are playing outside. From 12.30-1pm this swaps around, with our key stage 2 children eating lunch whilst the key stage 1 and foundation pupils play outside.

Children can either bring a healthy packed lunch or choose from our academy meals – these are prepared on site and paid for in advance. We use a cashless system for payment of meals called 'Squid' – details of this will be provided if your son/daughter is successful in applying for a place at the academy.

A wide range of playground games take place during lunchtimes, and our staff oversee these activities to ensure all children are safe and happy.

Break time for children in years 1-3

End of the academy day Staff see out pupils at the end of the day, unless children are attending one of our wide range of after-school clubs.



Wrap around care

We support families of our pupils with wrap around care that is provided on site by Thrumpton Kids' Club.

Breakfast club

Breakfast club* runs each morning from 7am. Children are given a nutritious breakfast and have activities organised for them prior to the academy day beginning.

*charges apply – breakfast club from £1.50-£5.50 per child

After-school club

After-school club* runs each evening from 3.30pm until 6pm. Children are given a healthy snack and have a range of activities organised for them.

*charges apply – after school club from £6.00 per child

Extra-curricular activities

We encourage all pupils to get involved in activities outside of their regular lessons to try new things, meet new friends and help them to develop new skills. The academy offers a number of clubs that might interest your son/ daughter including:

- football netball zumba Young Voices choir
- drama clubs
 cooking
 Lego club
- construction computing art cricket

The academy also takes part in local tournaments in sports such as football, athletics and netball.



Admissions

Every year we welcome eager children into our academy community as they begin their educational journey. This is also an exciting but important time for parents – making the choice of where to apply to is a major decision, and we hope to provide interesting and relevant information to support you to make the right choice.

We offer term-time tours of our fabulous facilities giving parents and guardians the chance to find out what life at Thrumpton is like on a normal day at the academy. Call our office team on **01777 702092** to book your individual family tour.
