Science:

Water Conservation.

Keep a record of how much water you use in a day. Think of every time you have turned a tap on (whether that is to drink, wash, clean your teeth, water plants in the garden etc), flushed the toilet or used water in any other way.

You can storyboard your day out (similar to the way Developing Experts have on their presentation) or you can do this as a chart showing what you used water for and how you did this.

Afterwards complete an audit of this – looking at ways you could have possibly saved some water during your day (for instance did you leave the tap running while you were cleaning your teeth)

Computing: Work through the levels on rapid router, to create an algorithm to guide the car around the road, running it as a program and debugging errors and use logical reasoning to negotiate the route you need to take. On the other side colour your items in – these don't have to be the colours of the actual items, you can make these bold and striking. Think about the colours you are going to use for the best effect before you colour them.

History & Geography

During our topic on Ancient Greece we have looked at the Olympic Games and their origins in Greece. We found that these used to all take place in the same place (Olympia, near Mt Olympus). But, modern Olympic Games move around the globe. Using Oddizi, I want you to consider the pros and cons of hosting a modern Olympic Games.
