Art & Design / Design & Technology

- In the Tate Modern art gallery in London Andy Warhol's artwork can be found. Research who Andy Warhol was and create a mini biography all about him.
- Using your knowledge of Andy Warhol recreate a piece of art similar to his style. You might want to create a repeated self-portrait pattern using a variety of bright colours. Or draw a modern artistic impression of a household object such as a tv remote, can of baked beans, hairbrush etc.
- In history and English last week you studied all about The Great Fire of London. Create a silhouette piece of artwork to show how the buildings were destroyed by the fire.
- The Great Fire of London started in a bakery on Pudding Lane. Have a go at baking something you could sell in bakery.
 - Research different recipes
 - Think how you could adapt the recipe – could you include chocolate drops, raisins, cherries etc?
 - Follow the recipe and make the product.
 - Evaluate it! Were you pleased by the overall outcome? Was it cooked for long enough? Was it sweet enough? Create a table of your findings.
 - Ask other members of your family to try it too, ask them to fill in your evaluation.

Work through the different levels to create an algorithm on screen and run it as a programme. Practise debugging by detecting and correcting errors. Then use logical reasoning to predict where the lorry will go.

- Practise your string instrument if it is at home.
- Compose your own music.
- Create your own rhythm cards and play rhythm bingo.
- Go to BBC Ten Pieces and pick a piece to listen to and learn about.
- Choose a composer and write some facts to use for Composer of the Month.

Extra Activities:

- Make a meal for somebody else- maybe a sandwich, warm a tin of soup up ... or something even more technical!
- Design a healthy menu for a café; You might want to include creating a logo for the menu, an advert for the café (for the radio, TV and magazine), - decide the price for the food (remember the cost of all of the food!), - design the layout of the café, - write a biography of the café owner - design what makes a great customer.
- Learn to sign words using British Sign Language. <https://www.british-sign.co.uk/> Can you learn to sign your name, film it and post it onto Class Dojo?
- Learn to say hello / goodbye / thank-you / please / my name is in 5 different languages.
- Plant seeds, water them regularly and watch them grow. Maybe you could plant sunflower seeds and measure over time how much it grows.
