## **Academy Overview**

#### 1) Context

Thrumpton Primary Academy is situated within the town centre of Retford.

Every staff member in school is aware of the need to diminish the difference between SEND and Non-SEND. Thrumpton Primary Academy considers the best ways to allocate SEND provision following rigorous diagnostic data analysis and knowledge of the whole child. The challenges facing individual children are varied and there is no "One size fits all".

To date Thrumpton Primary Academy has a total of 14% of children on their SEND register, within this 0.8% of children have an EHC (Educational Health Care Plan) provided by their local authority. Both of these are above the Nottinghamshire average but are below national baseline statistics.

At Thrumpton Primary Academy, 27% of children have speech, language and communication needs, of children 18% have Social, Emotional and Mental Health Needs, 6.1% of children have Cognition and Learning needs and 3% of children require Sensory and Physical support.

Several of these children may have multiple areas of needs that are categorised as a primary and secondary areas of need.

Our greatest primary area of need is Cognition and Learning.

The SEND register is reviewed termly by the SENDCo.

## 2) Identification of SEND at Thrumpton Primary Academy

All children at Thrumpton Primary Academy have the right to quality first teaching which provides adaptation to the curriculum and the learning environment within school. Further identification of SEND is identified as follows:

- Teachers are able to complete the 'Assess, Plan, Do' cycle by completing a Diverse Academies Graduated Approach and requesting internal support from Assistant SENDCo or Inclusion lead through the 'Include Me Platform'.
- Specialist transition between early years and within in year transfers
- Support from outside agencies such as health and specialist teachers from termly Springboard referrals.

#### 6) Working in Partnership with Parents and Carers

Thrumpton Primary Academy believes in working with parents as partners to ensure the best provision for all children.

- SEND reviews with parents are made when discussing learning plans and healthcare information. There is not a limited number for these reviews as it is personalised to the child.
- Parental comments can be collected to inform individual children's learning plan.
- Additional time and a meeting with the SENDCo at parent's evenings is offered for children on the SEND register and parents who need support.
- Parent Voice is important to the development of SEND within our Academy and this is collected termly.
- Our Graduated Approach process considers parent voice in the identification of support for children with SEND.
- All referrals to outside agencies are completed alongside the parent and allocated time is given with the SENDCo to support parents to complete these for the request of outside support from health and mental health services.

# 7) Links with Other agencies and Voluntary organisations

Thrumpton Primary Academy has strong links when working with Nottinghamshire County Council multi-agencies and health professionals across the county. Thrumpton Primary Academy is a part of the Retford Oaks Family of schools and the SENDCo attends family Springboard termly to access training and additional funding to meet the needs of all pupils.

To date, Thrumpton Primary Academy works alongside the following specialist services including health:

- SJ Therapy Speech and Language Therapy Services
