



What is remote learning?

If your child needs to be away from school because they are unable to attend school or local restrictions require them to remain at home, they will receive their education through a mixture of videos and independent activities set by their teacher and supported by a parent/carer. This will ensure that your child maintains and potentially develops their skills when not in the academy.

What if my child is unwell?

If your child is ill and not well-enough to complete remote learning whilst at home, work will not be set. Please let your child's teacher know when your child is well enough to access the work.

How will the academy provide this?


- All of the work will be set by the teacher via the Home Learning globe on Weduc.
- The videos and lessons can be accessed on a range of devices so laptops are not necessarily needed.
- The teacher will maintain weekly contact whilst your child is at home.
- The teacher will use their knowledge of your child (how they learn, what their learning priorities are, what technology/ resources they have access to at home) to put together relevant activities.
- The activities will link to the current class learning/ topic to make the learning relevant so when your child returns to school, they will not have missed big chunks of learning.
- The activities provided will be short bursts of learning, which are easily resourced in the home, and there will be no expectations to print off resources at home.

What will the academy provide?

The teacher will provide learning activities for the child to complete at home which are linked directly to the current class learning/topic.

What does the academy need from the parent/ carer?

- Honesty and engagement. If you cannot support the activities set, please tell the teacher why. This will enable the teacher to change the approach and suggest alternative activities.
- It is important that your child accesses their home learning every day that they would normally be in school and keeps, as far as possible, to what would be their normal routine. However, we appreciate that routines may have to change, so children can complete the work at a convenient time in the day. We will be able to see their responses to the lessons and quizzes to check for engagement.
- To be kept up to date on how you child is doing in terms of their home learning. This could be via a Weduc message, email or phone call.
- An understanding that the academy has a legal obligation to provide learning for your child whist they are at home.
